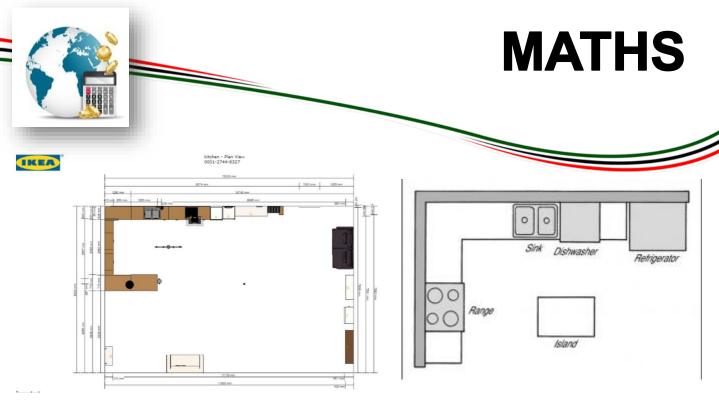

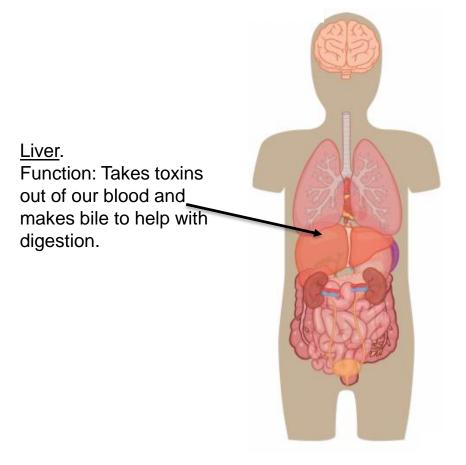

Welcome to Bedford Science. We are looking forward to learning and investigating with you! Have a go at some of these science **challenges**:

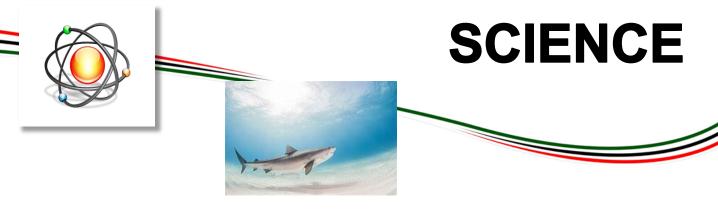


1) Can you label the organs of the human body? **Challenge**: What is the job (function) of each organ?

Organs to label: lungs, trachea, brain, kidneys, bladder, large intestine, small intestine, heart, stomach, rectum.



2) Experiment at home: Can you plant some seeds? Investigate which seeds grow the tallest if you change these variables: 1. one in the light and watered, 2. one in the shade and watered, 3. one in the light no water, 4. one in the shade no water. Draw pictures of each plant. **Challenge**: can you label the parts of a plant?



3) Water resistance slows down moving objects. Sharks can move quickly because they have streamlined bodies (they have a shape that lets them move through the water easily). It is difficult to run in water because it pushes against you.

Experiment at home: Can you draw or make an object (e.g. boat) that can move easily through the water. Think about the science involved in this design. Stick your photo or diagram here:

4) Testing the properties of materials.

You can test to see which material is a thermal insulator. Which material will keep a cup of tea the hottest for longest? (Make sure you get the permission from an adult before using the kettle).

On a separate piece of paper can you:

- a) Plan which materials to wrap around your cups. E.g. foil, cloth, paper.
- b) Control your variables. E.g use the same amount of tea each time.
- c) Write a method what will you do, step by step?
- d) Write a prediction. Which tea will remain the hottest and why?
- e) Draw a diagram.
- f) Collect some results.
- g) Write a conclusion. What did you find out?

What is a CAM?

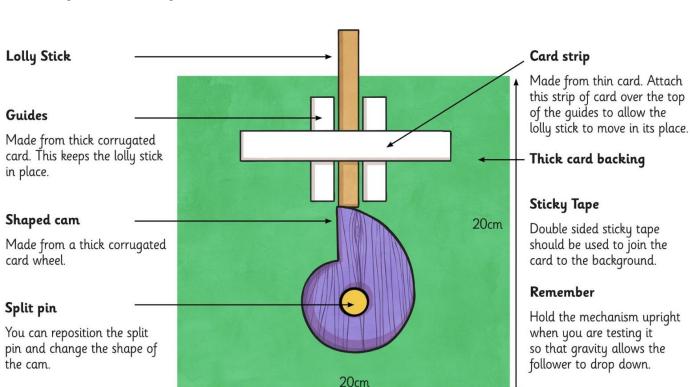
A cam is a rotating or sliding piece in a mechanical connection used especially in transforming rotary motion into linear motion (up and down). They are used in cars and in lots of types of machines that need to change motion.





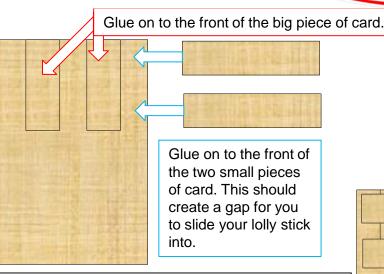


Follow the diagram on this page and the next page to make your own example of a simple cam mechanism.

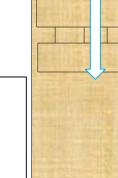

Glue on to the front of the two small pieces of card. This should create a gap for you to slide your lolly stick into.

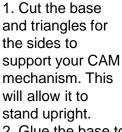


- 1. Cut 4 slips of cardboard 1cm wide.
- 2. Cut 2 of the slips at 5cm length and 2 at 8cm length.
- 3. Cut a large piece of card for the back -12cm x 15cm.
- 4. Glue them into position as shown above.
- 5. Slide your lolly stick in between the gap. The lolly stick should be free moving



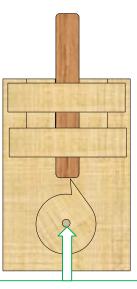






- 2. Glue the base to the bottom.
- 3. Glue the triangles to the side to support the frame





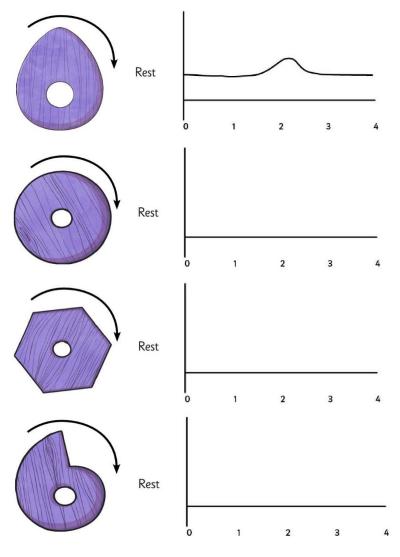
Use thick card to cut out the CAM shape. Don't make it too big - measure the area underneath the lolly stick first. Attach the CAM using a pin or a screw. Ask parent / guardian first. Be careful as these are sharp. Make sure the CAM is free moving and can be turned easily by hand.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

The Movement of Different Shaped Cams

CAMs come in lots of shapes and sizes. This changes the type of motion it produces. Try replacing the cam with different shapes from the example below and explain how the motion changes. Draw a line by looking at the top of the lolly stick. If it moves up and down draw a bump either up or down from the line. Use the guide to help.





The Lolly stick gradually went up over a second then gradually back down over a second as the CAM rotated.



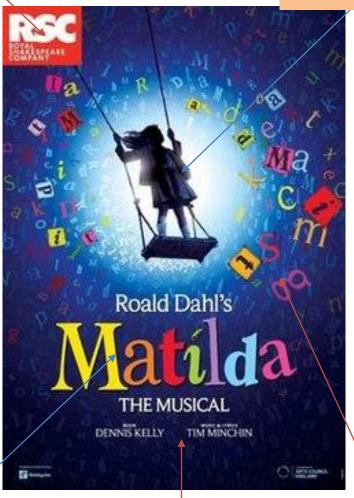

Designing a Medieval Coat of Arms

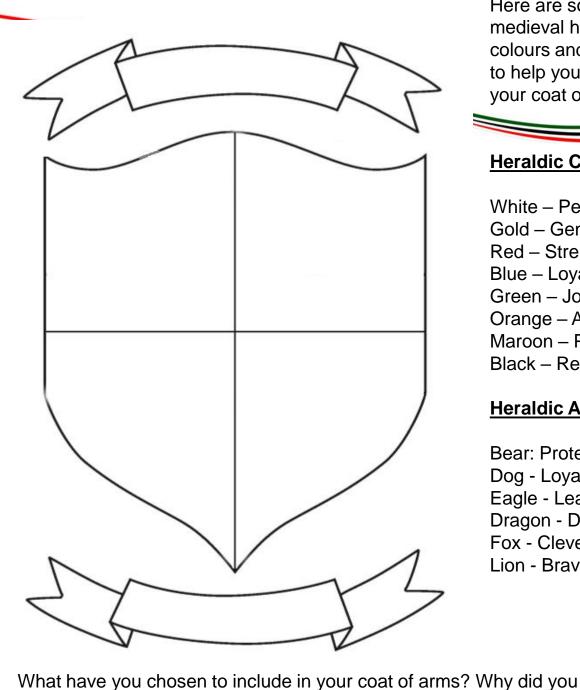

Heraldry uses different symbols and colours as a form of identification. A key part of heraldry was a coat of arms. Each family would have a coat of arms that acted like their personal logo. A family's coat of arms would appear in lots of places.
