How would you rate the remote learning experience your child is receiving?






 85% of parents answered "high rating (4-5) for this question. 5. How often do you check that your child is working on the work set remotely?

What remote learning can you expect for your child daily?

Work should be set for each lesson that your child would have in their timetable.

The work for the 5 lessons should be signposted on Frog each day.

Teachers might also send resources and further support via school email.

Teachers are expected to provide Zoom lessons so that we can ensure quality in our remote learning.

Not all lessons will be on Zoom, students will have the opportunity to work independently too.

Students should ensure that they submit work when requested to do so.

What should I expect of my child during remote learning?


- To engage with all remote learning. It is especially important that all students attend Zoom lessons.
 We want your child to follow the teacher instructions carefully and to email their teacher directly when they get stuck.
- We want our students to be alert, focused and thinking during remote learning. Actively engage and interact with the teacher.
- To have **healthy routines and habits**. Their remote learning day should mirror the normal school day.
- Your child should be **organised and keep a record of their work** so that they can bring it into school when they return.

How will you check whether my child is engaging with their work and how will I be informed if there are concerns?

- We keep an attendance registers for to all scheduled Zoom lessons. Inform school in advance if your child is unable to attend a Zoom lesson for any reason.
- Non-engagement during remote learning can trigger a phone call home to ascertain the reason for absence.
- Your child will be expected to submit their
 work to their teacher by the requested
 deadline. When a child does not submit work,
 or if the quality of the work is below the
 student's potential, then the teacher will log
 this as 'Non-engagement with home learning'.
 The incident log can trigger a phone call home.
